

Dock Specifications for 2019

- Structures authorized by this permit shall not extend waterward more than 100 feet from the shoreline nor be more than 6 feet in width
- Configuration of dock may vary in plan (i.e. straight, T, U, or L shaped, etc.) provided the total square footage of the dock does not exceed 150 square feet, including finger piers, deck, platform, etc.
- All docks and access stairs shall be constructed with the intent of a temporary seasonal installation; no permanent features may be added to facilitate dock or stairway installation. No stairway and dock components, or other materials, may remain on State Park lands after the date stated on a valid permit.
- Docks must be constructed in such a way as to not require specialized equipment for installation/removal. No pilings may be used unless hand driven and meet all Army Corp and DEC regulations and guidelines.
- No hoist ways may be installed as part of the dock permit
- Use of creosote treated wood under this permit is prohibited in New York State. All treated wood must be aged in the open air for at least three months prior to in-water use. Wood must be clean and free of surface deposits. Only appropriate preservatives approved for marine use are permitted
- All docks and access stairways will be required to have a gate or other mechanism to limit access by the general public
- Dock must prominently display permit number for identification; docks that are not labelled will be considered unpermitted and handled as abandoned property
- No dock installation will be permitted which impairs the integrity of the embankment or shoreline
- No license/permit holder or other may disturb, cut, clear or uproot vegetation from the bed of the Niagara River.
- Vehicle tires shall not be used for mooring purposes
- Floatation devices for docks shall be foam blocks, pontoons, or other material manufactured for floatation.
- Metal barrels, drums, or other containers that are not specifically made for floatation are prohibited
- Docks and stairs construction shall not restrict access on Parks property (e.g. trails, maintenance operations)
- No vegetation or trees may be removed to facilitate the installation of docks or stairways for access
- Other than for the installation of the dock and temporary stairway, no license/permit holder or other may change, modify or disturb the bed or banks of the Niagara River, nor remove from its bed or banks, sand, gravel or other material. Banks means land immediately adjacent to watercourse, extending 50 feet horizontally from mean high water line.
- No wall, bulkhead or other shoreline protection shall be installed as part of the dock permit
